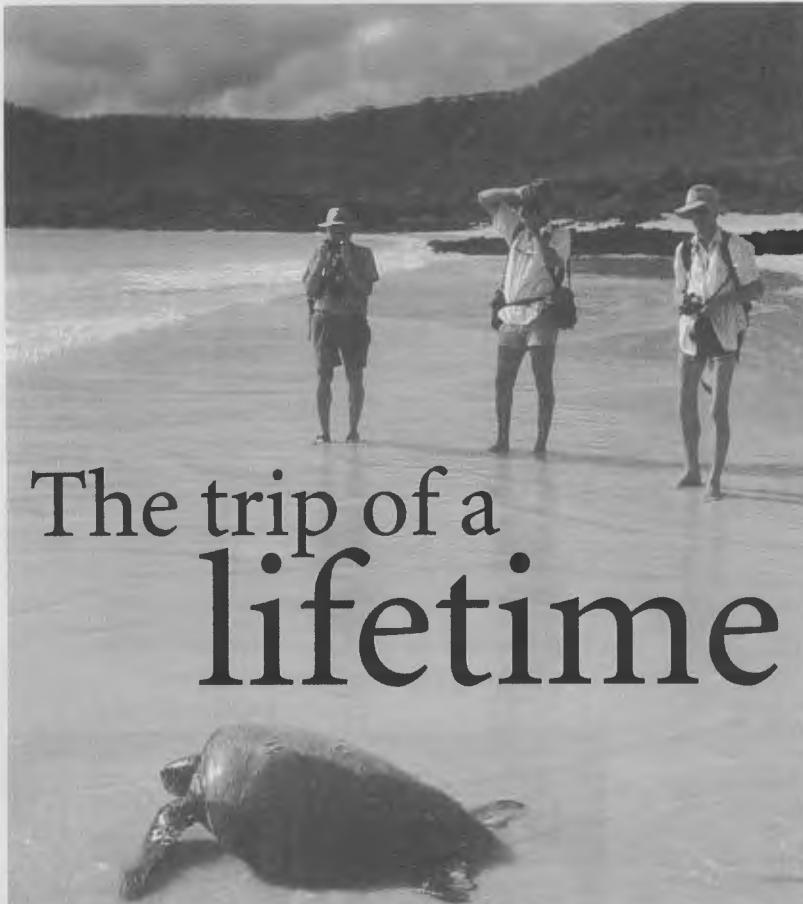


8 Tenses and time expressions
